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## Joy, Joy, Joy and even more Joy!

We are just about half way through our Abundant Joy capital campaign. In 2016 we asked you all to prayerfully consider making a three-year pledge to raise funds for three specific areas in the life of the church. A total of \$1,288,568 was pledged to be paid over a three year period. So far, we have received \$628,373. How's it going? In one word...great. If you want more than one word...here it is.

You pledged a total of \$515,427 for a new organ. This is only about half of the total cost for an organ and its installation, so we have not been able to begin this project. The funds are being invested by the Foundation and will continue to grow and we seek more funding. We encourage folks who did not pledge to make individual gifts to what is now called "The Organ Fund". John Wright and Marko Petricic will tell you about the need. Once the Abundant Joy campaign has been completed the Session will decide how to go about securing the rest of the funding needed for the organ.

You pledged \$360,799 for a new Mission Endowment Fund. These dollars are also invested and growing until the campaign is completed. Once the total pledged has been received the Mission Team will select special projects to be funded by the growth of the endowment. The principal will remain and grow to allow even more mission in the future. These

projects will be above and beyond those already in our annual budget.

You pledged \$412,342 to cover the campaign costs and reduce the loan we have with Presbyterian Investment and Loan Program of our General Assembly. The campaign costs have been covered and we apply the income from the campaign as it comes in to reduce the principal on the loan. So far to date we have lowered our debt by \$53,777.



I want to thank all of you who made pledges during the Abundant Joy campaign. One of the great things about this congregation is that you do indeed honor your pledges and the money comes in as expected. IF you were not here when we held this campaign, it is not too late to take part. You can get a pledge card from the church office and jump right in. You can also make one-time gifts to the campaign by letting Lori know your gift is for the Abundant Joy capital campaign.

If you have other questions, please let us know. The JOY is abundant, and we hope you can share it as well.

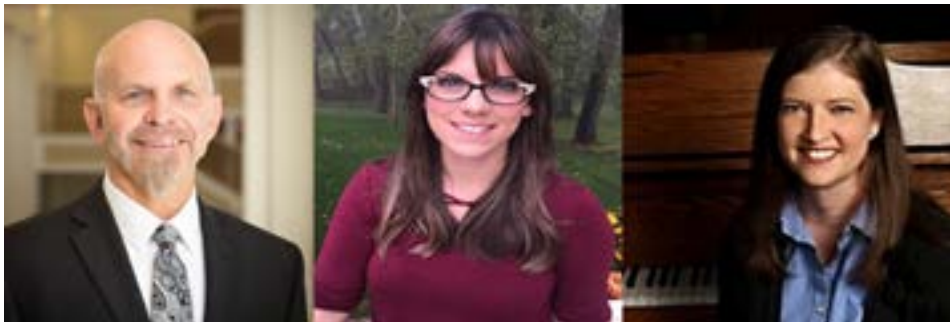


## Musical Presentation

## Indiana Churches Offer 4,122 Letters for the Hungry!

Thanks to all of you who wrote or personalized a letter to Congress in support of programs for the hungry as part of the Bread for the World Offering of Letters.

Our letters were combined with those from 51 other Indiana churches and groups, and 4,122 letters (30 from NPC) were delivered during visits to the local offices of our senators and representatives. African Methodist Episcopal, Baptist, Catholic, Disciples of Christ, Episcopal, Lutheran, Mennonite, Presbyterian, United Methodist, United Church of Christ, Unitarian Universalist and other groups combined efforts to remind our elected leaders that hunger is an issue that needs to be addressed now.

When meeting with a staff member of Senator Joe Donnelly, who received 992 letters, Bread members learned that Senator Donnelly is given a report every Friday afternoon that enumerates the letters, emails and phone calls that have come to his office during the week.

Writing letters is affective and our legislators recognize that we are watching what bills they are writing/co-sponsoring and how they are voting on hunger issues.

This united action is vital in order to be heard above the din of fake news and daily head-spinning false statements. We must continue to focus on what we can and must do – to champion the needs of the hungry – the children, the disabled and the elderly and those who are struggling to overcome life-changing events that can happen to any one of us at any time. As Christians we believe in caring for all of God's children. Let it be so.
