## MUSIC IN WORSHIP

**Psalm 118: 1- 2, 14 – 24** is the psalm traditionally sung or read on  
Easter Day. We praise God for his unfailing love; we celebrate the  
day in which God has set up his cornerstone – the stone which “the  
builders rejected” (verse 22); and we praise God for bringing  
triumph over our enemies. The central thematic statement of the  
psalm occurs in verse 17: “I shall not die, but live, and declare the  
works of the Lord.” Martin Luther saw in it the story of his own life  
and purpose for his living and put these words on the wall of his  
study.

**Today's Offertory anthem**, "O God, Beyond All Praising" is an arrangement of the hymn tune THAXTED, composed by Gustav Holst (1874 – 1934) for his orchestral suite *The Planets*. In 1921 he adapted the tune to fit the patriotic poem "I vow to thee my country," which was sung at Princess Diana's wedding in 1981 and funeral in 1997. The text of the arrangement the choir sings today was written by British theologian Michael Perry (1942 – 1996). Of the final phrase - "we'll triumph through our sorrows and rise to bless you still" - Perry has written that it was a "reflection on my remembered determination of youthful days to overcome acute disappointment and personal loss." Today's arrangement of the hymn is by Greensboro, North Carolina composer Dan Forrest (born 1978). It was purchased by John and Cheryl Plunkett in memory of Dorothy Wallace.
